

→ Reynolds Cahoon - (F) ✕

Born 30 Apr 1790, died 29 Apr 1861 in South Cottonwood SLC. *One of the first to join in Kirtland.* Baptized 11 Oct 1830. Was married 3 times and had 10 children. Worked on Kirtland Temple, he was a counselor to Bishop Whitney in Kirtland. He was a counselor in Stake Presidency in Adam-ondi-Ahman. Reynolds, along with Hyrum Smith, dug the first trench with their hands for the walls of the temple in Kirtland. Was one of a committee of 3 charged in a revelation to build the temple. *Told Joseph Smith he would be a coward if he did not return to surrender to the law in Carthage.*

→ Simeon Carter - (F) ✕

Born 7 Jun 1794 in Killingworth, Conn., baptized and ordained an Elder in late 1830 or early 1831 in Kirtland, missionary, ordained a High Priest in Jun 1831 by Lyman Wight, moved to Jackson county in 1833 and presided over a branch there, Zion's Camp, Clay County High Council, Far West High Council, Brigham sent Simeon to settle Box Elder Creek (Brigham City). Simeon remained faithful all his life and died on 3 Feb 1869 in Brigham City, Utah. *Joined when Parley P. Pratt left a copy of the Book of Mormon as told in the story of Stu Bod the Bull Dog.*

→ John Corrill - (A!) ?

Born 17 Sep 1794, Baptized 10 Jan 1831. High Priest at Morley Farm in June 1831, 2nd counselor to Bishop Truman Partridge. Called to Missouri to watch over several branches, one of the leading men in Missouri, was in charge of finishing the Kirtland Temple. One of the founders of Far West. Chosen as keeper of the Lord's Storehouse in Far West, Mo. *His faith faltered almost overnight.* Turned against the Church, 'Would not yield his judgment to anything proposed by the Church.' Excommunicated 17 Mar 1839 in Quincy. Wrote a 50 page pamphlet on 'Why I left the Church'.

→ Solomon Hancock - (F) ✕

Born 14 Aug 1793 in Springfield, Mass., baptized in 1831 in Kirtland by Parley P. Pratt, missionary, moved to Jackson County in 1832, High Council in Clay County in 7 Jul 1834, High Council in Far West, High Council in Lima, IL, president of the Yelrome, IL. Branch, Always helping the distressed and needy. Remained faithful the rest of his life. Died 2 Dec 1847 near Council Bluffs, Iowa.

→ Martin Harris - (A*) ✕

A witness to the Book of Mormon. Born 18 May 1783 in Easttown, NY, baptized 6 Apr 1830 by Joseph Smith in Fayette, NY, missionary, Zion's Camp, on the 1st High Council in Kirtland, assisted in selecting, ordaining, and instructing the 1st 12 Apostles, ordained a High Priest by Lyman Wight on 3 Jun 1831 in Kirtland. Disfellowshipped in Sep 1837 and excommunicated in Dec 1837, left the church for 32 years, rebaptized on 17 Sep 1870, and died 10 Jul 1875 in Clarkston, Utah. Never denied his testimony of the Book of Mormon.
