

Thomas B. Marsh - (A*)

Born 1 Nov 1799 in Acton, Mass., baptized 3 Sep 1830 by David Whitmer in Cayuga Lake, NY, missionary, branch president in Jackson County, MO, Clay County High Council, ordained an Apostle on 15 Feb 1835, 1st president of the quorum of the 12 (because he was the oldest member, later the order was by seniority). Excommunicated on 17 Mar 1839. Rebaptized on 16 Jul 1857 in SLC. Died in Ogden, Utah, a pauper, in Jan. 1866. *Cream Stripping incident that involved his wife was the reason for his leaving the Church. He refused to acknowledge the decisions of three court proceedings and the counsel that was repeatedly given.*

Issac Morley - (F)

Born 11 Mar 1786 in Mass., baptized 15 Nov 1830 in Kirtland by Oliver Cowdery, counselor to Bishop Partridge, ordained a Patriarch in 1837, his family endured the worst of persecution in Missouri, missionary, stake president in IL, settled Sanpete County in Utah with 224 pioneers. He baptized the Indian chief "Joseph" Walker. Always faithful and died in Fairview Utah on 24 Jun 1864 and is buried in Manti, Utah.

John Murdock - (F)

Born 15 Jul 1792 in Kortwright, NY, baptized 5 Nov 1830 by Parley P. Pratt in Kirtland, missionary, saw the Father and the Son in the school of the prophets in the Whitney Store, Zion's Camp, High Council in Clay County, presiding officer in the Far West High Council, Bishop in Nauvoo, stake presidency in Lima, IL, in Salt Lake City he was a Bishop, High Councilor, and a delegate to the House of Representatives. First mission president in Australia, ordained a Patriarch by Heber C. Kimball. Died: 23 Dec 1871 in Beaver, Utah. Father of the twins that were adopted by Joseph and Emma.

Edward Partridge - (F)

Born 27 Aug 1793 in Pittsfield, Mass., baptized 11 Dec 1830 in NY by Joseph Smith, missionary, first Bishop in the church, sent to be the Bishop in Missouri, was tared and feathered in the public square in Independence, Bishop in Nauvoo. He remained faithful to the end. He died 27 May 1840 in Nauvoo. In the D&C the Lord revealed that He had received Edward Partridge "unto myself."

Parley Parker Pratt - (F)

Born 12 Apr 1807 in Burlington, NY, baptized 1 Sep 1830 by Oliver Cowdery in Seneca Lake, NY, missionary extraordinaire, one of the four missionaries to come to Kirtland in 1830, ordained an Apostle on 21 Feb 1835, Zion's Camp, recruited for the Mormon Battalion, baptized John Taylor in Canada on 9 May 1836, teacher in the Missouri school of the Elders, church printer (editor) of the Millennial Star in England. Always faithful and died a martyrs death in May 1857 in Van Buren, Arkansas.
